Altogether there is sixteen in camp. Dinner is ready at 1 p.m. & everybody was satisfied with it. The meat was as tender as chicken.

Seconds Law & Bruce who had been trouting arrived back late, but as there was plenty of dinner left they had their share. We had a few visitors in

the afternoon, & there were various duties to perform.

We struck camp after tea and C. Dyson took most of our gear down in the side car of his motor cycle. This relieved us a lot as there were the tents, chairs, four tables, latrine & various other heavy articles to be carried down.

We walked to Rippenden where we boarded a bus for home. We had a very enjoyable camp although the weather was slightly on the cold side.

The programme included a Sunday morning service at 11 a.m., the Skipper giving a good address on "Discipline". A.S.M. Wilcock read the Scriptures while P.H. Wood & Scout H. Schofield took the prayers.
